



Permit City Lease Up To Forty Years

Shall Section 111 of the Charter be amended pursuant to Ordinance No. 7542 to allow the city to grant a lease of streets or public places or property for a period of up to forty years (rather than the current maximum of 20 years) upon approval by a two-thirds vote of all council members?

Ballot Question 2B

City Council Compensation

Shall Section 7 of the Charter be amended pursuant to Ordinance No. 7544 to provide that starting in 2008, city council members will be compensated at the rate of \$500 per meeting attended, not to exceed \$1000 compensation per month, adjusted in the future by reference to the Consumer Price Index?

The proposed amendment would delete existing language that currently compensates city council members at \$169.89 per meeting not to exceed four meetings per calendar month.

Ballot Question 2C

Clarifying Circumstances That Cause a City Council Vacancy

Shall the first paragraph of Section 8 of the Charter that provides for creation of vacancies on city council be amended pursuant to Ordinance No. 7537 to specify that removal of a city council member for the commission of a crime is triggered by conviction of a felony?

Ballot Question 2D

Filling City Council Vacancies

Shall Section 8 of the Charter be amended pursuant to Ordinance No. 7547 to provide for filling city council vacancies as follows?

If one or two vacancies occur, they shall be filled by election as follows:

- If such vacancies occur on or after January 1 and before July 1, the election shall be held on the first Tuesday in November of the year in which the vacancy or vacancies occur.
- If such vacancies occur on or after July 1 and before January 1, the election shall be held on the first Tuesday in November of the year following that in which the vacancy or vacancies occur.

- An election to fill a vacancy may be held on an earlier date if another city election is already scheduled for the earlier date and if it is feasible to hold the vacancy election in conjunction with the already scheduled election.

If three or more vacancies occur, a special election shall be held within 90 days or as soon thereafter as is feasible as determined by the city manager.

If more than four vacancies exist, prior to the special election to fill those vacancies a quorum of the council shall be comprised of a majority of all the remaining council members.
